

About the Presenters...

Stephen E. Craig, Ph.D., LPC

Dr. Craig is an Associate Professor and Unit Director of the Counselor Education Program in the Department of Counselor Education and Counseling Psychology (CECP) at Western Michigan University (WMU). He has previously served as member of the American Counseling Association's Professional Standards Committee, President of the Michigan Association for Counselor Education and Supervision (MACES), accreditation site visitor for the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP), and for five years, Dr. Craig has taught the doctoral course in clinical supervision at WMU.



Dr. Craig is a licensed professional counselor who maintains a part-time private practice, S. E. Craig Counseling & Consulting, PLLC. In his private practice, Dr. Craig provides clinical supervision for Limited Licensed Professional Counselors who are seeking full licensure. Prior to completing his doctoral work, he worked within the community mental health system in Collin County, Texas.

His scholarly contributions are concentrated in three principle areas: counselor training, primarily around counselor supervision and preparation of child and adolescent counselors; the Adlerian construct of social interest and its relationship to counselor training and supervision; and professional issues in Counselor Education, including the interface of politics and the profession and gender representation within the profession. Dr. Craig received a B.A. in Psychology from Texas Tech University in 1994, an M.S. in Community Counseling from Texas A&M University at Commerce in 1996, and his Ph.D. in Counseling and Student Services from University of North Texas in 1999.

Eric M. Sauer, Ph.D., LP

Dr. Sauer is an associate professor in the Department of Counselor Education and Counseling Psychology at Western Michigan University. He is currently serving as the director of the Center for Counseling and Psychological Services – Grand Rapids (CCPS-GR), and co-director of the counseling psychology doctoral program. He also is the current president of the Association of Psychology Training Clinics (APTCL), which is the national organization of psychology training clinic directors.



Dr. Sauer is a licensed psychologist who has been providing clinical services for more than 20 years. Since 2006, he has been a senior associate at Jenison Psychological Services. In addition to seeing clients, he provides clinical supervision to master's and doctoral-level psychologists.

In terms of professional and scholarship interests, Dr. Sauer has published extensively on the clinical applications of attachment theory, counseling psychology training, and clinical supervision and training. Dr. Sauer received his B.S. from Michigan State University in 1988 and his M.A. in counseling psychology from Ball State University in 1991. He earned his Ph.D. in counseling psychology from Michigan State University in 1999. He completed a predoctoral internship at The University of Iowa and postdoctoral training at The University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Clinical Supervision Training

The practice of clinical supervision has become a specialized area of practice of mental health professionals. Licensed Professional Counselors, and other mental health professionals, have an ethical and legal responsibility to demonstrate that they have training to engage in the practice of clinical supervision. From an ethical perspective, the American Counseling Association 2005 Code of Ethics states the following on Boundaries of Competence: "Counselors practice only within the boundaries of their competence, based on their education, training, supervised experience..." (Section C.2.a., ACA 2005 Code of Ethics, p. 9). Furthermore, the Michigan Public Health Code and the Administrative Rules for Professional Counselors require LPCs to restrict their practice to those areas for which they have been specifically trained.

This training in clinical supervision will provide the mental health professional with a solid foundation in the essentials to becoming an effective clinical supervisor. Participants will learn about the ethical codes related to supervision, laws and administrative rules related to supervision, models and techniques for individual and group supervision, how to prepare a supervision disclosure statement and contract, evaluation strategies, and ways to resolve difficult supervisor-supervisee situations. There will also be a live demonstration of a supervision session at the end of the training, after which participants will be invited to engage in a question-answer discussion with the presenters. This course is essential for those mental health professionals and clinical supervisors who wish to learn the current research in clinical supervision, how to incorporate supervision into one's existing practice, and relevant ethical and legal considerations.

Dr. John S. Geisler is a Professor Emeritus in the Department of Counselor Education and Counseling Psychology at Western Michigan University. He is a licensed professional counselor, licensed master's social worker, and Approved Clinical Supervisor. He has numerous publications to his credit, was appointed by two Michigan governors to serve on the Michigan Board of Counseling, and has provided trainings to licensed mental health professionals for over 30 years. Dr. Geisler will provide a detailed review of the Michigan Public Health Code (licensure law) and the Administrative Rules that impact clinical supervisors.

Did you know? >>>

- Rule 338.1751 of the Administrative Rules of the Michigan Board of Counseling says, '(n) "Supervisor" means a licensed professional counselor who [shall have training in the function of supervision]. This subdivision takes effect January 1, 2005.'
- Section 333.18105 of the Michigan Public Health Code states, "A licensee shall not perform any acts, tasks, or functions within the practice of counseling unless he or she is trained to perform such acts, tasks, or functions."
- Ethical codes of most mental health professions, including the American Counseling Association call for practitioners to practice only within their boundaries of competence.
